Mount Fuji, the pride of Japan

Mount Fuji, having an altitude of 3,776 meters, is the highest mountain in Japan. The conical-shaped independent peak is beautiful from all angles and has been loved by Japanese from ancient times as their spiritual home. Mount Fuji was registered on the World Heritage List in 2013, inviting many climbers from overseas as well. Please enjoy Japan's number-one mountain!

About 700,000 years ago, a big mountain that would later become current Mount Fuji was born after the eruptions of Mount Komitake and the surrounding Mount Hakone and Mount Ashitaka. Many eruptions occurred since then, and it grew rapidly from about 80,000 years ago. The current shape was formed about five thousand years ago.

Fuji-ko and Mount Fuji climbing

Mount Fuji, after repeated eruptions, had been awed as a "mountain where a god lives" from ancient times, and a Sengen shrine was built at its foot to quell the eruptions. In the later stage of the Heian period (794-1185), Mount Fuji became a place of Shugen-do, a syncretism of Japan's traditional mountain worship and Buddhism, and then ascetic monks and practitioners started to climb Mount Fuji as a part of their ascetic training. In the Edo period (1603-1868), Fuji-ko, a religious organization whose biggest objective is to climb Mount Fuji, became popular especially among common people of the city of Edo. Fuji-ko prospered most from the mid to later Edo period, and Mount Fuji was very crowded. The area on the east of current Mt. Fuji Station, where you walk a little from the Kana-dorii gate in the direction of Mount Fuji, used to be a city of Oshi. Oshi, while working for Sengen Shrine, took care of worship climbers as a guide or accommodation host. Oshi's houses functioned as lodges for them. Worship climbers wore white travelers' clothes and aimed at the summit from Kitaguchi Hongu Fuji Sengen Shrine along Yoshida-guchi Trail.

Mount Fuji as a cultural heritage

Mount Fuji became a world cultural heritage site because it not only provides the beautiful appearance but also has generated a number of artworks from it and has special value as an object of worship. The "universal values of Mount Fuji" are (1) an object of worship, (2) landscape as a noted mountain, and (3) a source of art. Man'yo-shu, the oldest collection of Japanese poetry compiled in the later 7th century, contains works referring to Mount Fuji, and after that, many other classic works, including Taketori Monogatari and Kokin Wakashu, also depicted Mount Fuji. In the field of painting, ukiyo-e in the Edo period is famous. Thirty-six Views of Mount Fuji painted by Hokusai captured the heart of not only Japanese but also foreign people, and influenced a number of people.

Let's prepare for climbing Mount Fuji by knowing the climbing periods, climbing trails, and how to get to the trail entrances.



Can anyone try?

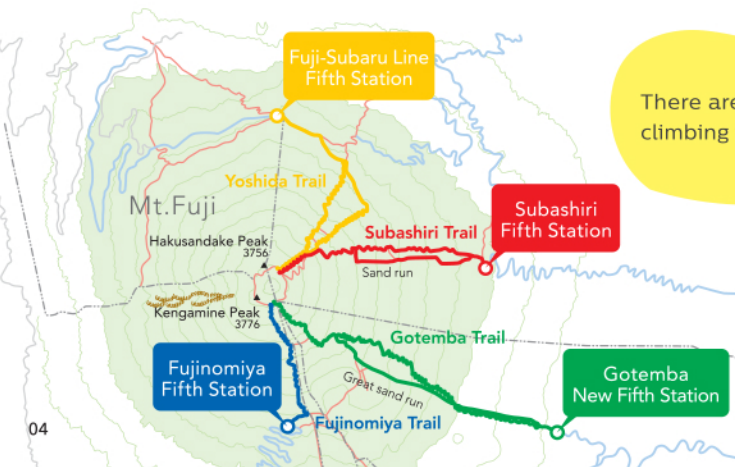
Mount Fuji is the highest mountain in Japan; therefore, it's not easy to climb. As the mountain has an altitude of over 3,000 meters, you should be more careful than in regular hiking. But don't worry, many first-time mountain climbers have tried Mount Fuji. Starting from the basic walking style, this guidebook will explain effective ways to successfully climb Mount Fuji.

How many climbing routes are there?

There are four major trails on Mount Fuji. One is on the north side of the mountain (climbing from Yamanashi Prefecture) and the other three are on the southeastern side (climbing from Shizuoka Prefecture.) The northernmost course is the Yoshida Trail, followed in the clockwise direction by the Subashiri Trail, Gotemba Trail, and the southernmost Fujinomiya Trail. The distance and difference in elevation, and the number of huts vary depending on the trail. You, therefore, need to choose one suited to your physical strength and experience. Start from deciding which trail you will take from among the four.

When can I climb Mount Fuji?

Climbing periods differ depending on the trail. The Yoshida Trail in Yamanashi Prefecture traditionally opens on July 1, but the other trails have no fixed date, and the opening day is determined every year according to the snow conditions. Outside the climbing periods, huts are closed; therefore, restrooms are not available, so the general climbing season for Mount Fuji is from July to September 10 when the huts are open.

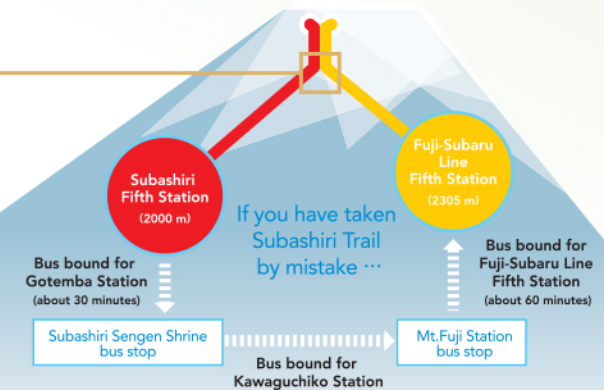
Fujinomiya Trail

Because the climbing season on Mt. Fuji is short, congestion is expected on weekends and consecutive holidays. We recommend leisurely climbing on weekdays in order to avoid congestion. Additionally, hurrying to view the sunrise at the summit could cause altitude sickness or an accident. View the beautiful sunrise along the way or at a hut depending on the weather, so climb at your own pace. You can check the congestion forecast calendar from here (Official Website for Mt. Be careful not to take the wrong route!
The descending path for the Yoshida Trail and the Subashiri Trail separates along the way.

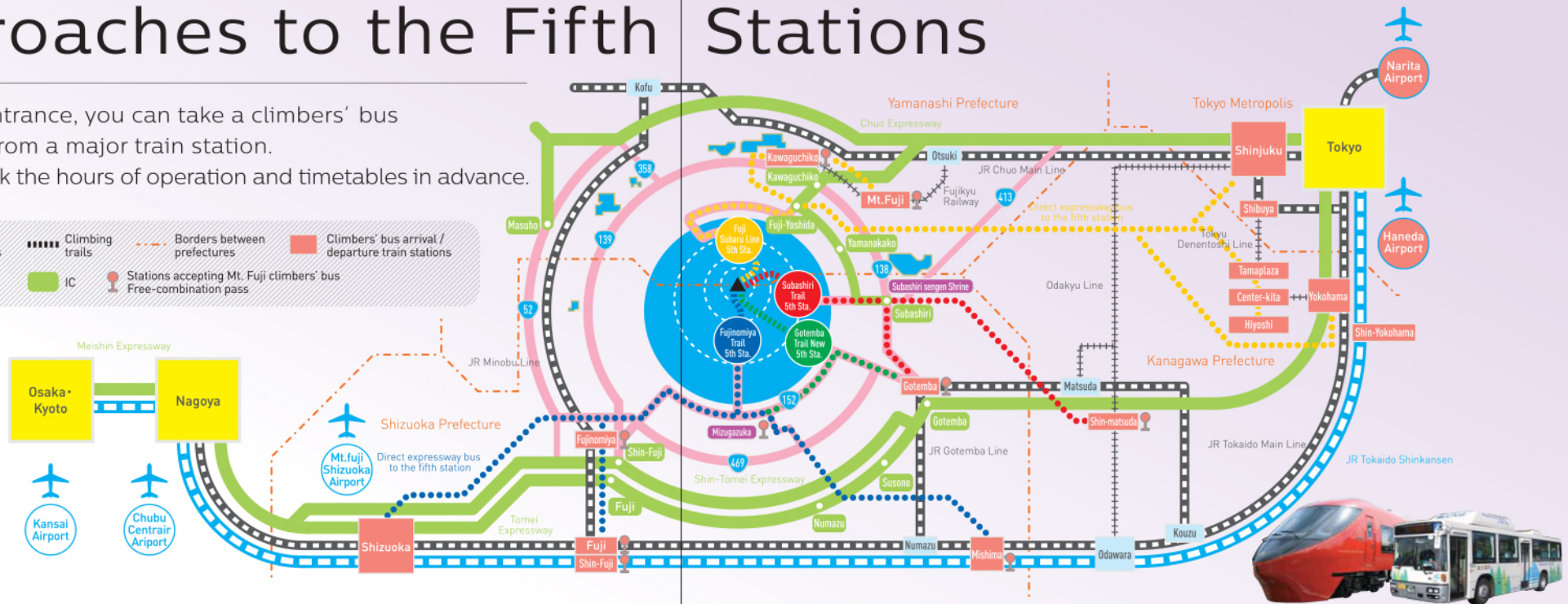
Although the climbing trails of Mount Fuji are developed to prevent straying, many climbers still take the wrong route when descending. It especially happens at the fork to the Yoshida Trail and the Subashiri Trail. Although these two routes take the same descending path from the summit, the trail separates at the Shita-edoya hut located at the eighth station. Signposts along the trails show the Yoshida Trail in yellow and the Subashiri Trail in red, so use the color as a guide when descending.



Approaches to the Fifth Stations

To a trail entrance, you can take a climbers' bus departing from a major train station.
Please check the hours of operation and timetables in advance.

Use a climbers' bus to a trail entrance

The climbers' bus operates from major train stations to the four trail entrances for a limited time only. The departure/arrival train stations vary according to the trail entrance.

There are express buses with direct connections to the trail entrances without the need to change to a climbers' bus, as well as express buses to departure/arrival train stations of the climbers' bus stated below.

Approaches from central Tokyo and nearby areas

Fuji-Subaru Line Fifth Station

[By train] Mt.Fuji Station and Kawaguchiko Station on the Fujikyū Railway are the terminal stations for the climbers' bus. First, go to Otsuki Station on the JR Chuo Main Line and transfer to the Fujikyū Railway, where it takes about 40 minutes by limited express. [By express bus] The express bus that connects to Shinjuku and the fifth station is convenient. You also can go to Kawaguchiko Station by express bus from Shibuya, Tokyo Station, or from Kanagawa Prefecture, Omiya Station, and Tsudanuma Station.

Subashiri Fifth Station

[By train] Shin-matsuda Station on the Odakyū line and Gotemba Station on the JR line are the terminals of the climbers' bus. [By express bus] Express buses bound for Gotemba area are available from Shibuya and Yokohama Station.

Gotemba New Fifth Station

[By train] Gotemba Station on the JR line is the terminal for the climbers' bus. [By express bus] Express buses bound for Gotemba area are available from Shibuya and Yokohama Station.

Fujinomiya Fifth Station

[By train] Climbers' buses are available from Mishima Station or Shin-fuji Station on the JR Tokaido Shinkansen Line. [By express bus] Use an express bus from Tokyo Station bound for Fujinomiya Station or from Narita Airport bound for Shin-fuji Station, and then switch to a climbers' bus.

Approaches from Shizuoka Prefecture

Fuji-Subaru Line Fifth Station

Express buses from Shizuoka Station or Mishima Station on the JR line bound for Kawaguchiko Station are convenient, from where you take a climbers' bus.

Subashiri Fifth Station and Gotemba New Fifth Station

Climbers' buses bound for both of the fifth stations are available from Gotemba Station on the JR line.

Fujinomiya Fifth Station

Express buses departing from Shizuoka Station on the JR line and going directly to the Fujinomiya fifth station are very convenient. Or you can use a climbers' bus from Shin-fuji Station, Fuji Station or Fujinomiya Station.

Approaches from the Tokai and Kinki regions prefectures

Fuji-Subaru Line Fifth Station

You can use an express bus from Nagoya, Osaka or Kyoto Station bound for Kawaguchiko Station and Mt.Fuji Station, from where you can take a climbers' bus.

Subashiri Fifth Station and Gotemba New Fifth Station

Express buses bound for Odawara via Gotemba are available from Osaka and Kyoto Station is convenient. Then you switch to a climbers' bus.

Fujinomiya Fifth Station

Express buses bound for Shin-fuji Station, Fuji Station and Fujinomiya Station are available from Osaka and Kyoto Station.

Approach using the Fujikyū Railway

At Otsuki Station on the JR Chuo Main Line, you can switch to the Fujikyū Railway, along which you can have a view of Mount Fuji while heading to it without suffering from traffic congestion. It provides you an advantage of being able to act punctually. Additionally, by using Fujisan View Express, in which there is Sweets Plan available (reservation required) exclusively on Saturdays, Sundays, and holidays, you can fully enjoy Mount Fuji even before climbing it.



*The parking areas at the respective trail entrances (fifth stations) have limited capacity. For environmental conservation and easing traffic congestion, we recommend using public transportation.

Yoshida Trail

Fuji-Subaru Line Fifth Station (2305 m) ▶▶▶ Kusushi Shrine (3720 m)

This is the most popular trail among the four with many huts and rest areas.
The trail also boasts convenient access from central Tokyo!

The Yoshida Trail is recommended for people climbing Mount Fuji for the first time and want to view the sunrise from the summit. The trail is the most popular among the four major climbing routes! Some of the reasons for this are the good access from central Tokyo and the many huts that provide a sense of security for climbers.

The Fuji-Subaru Line fifth station, its trail entrance, has many restaurants and souvenir shops and is crowded with many tourists, including foreign visitors, even outside the climbing period. The trail starts from this busy atmosphere. You first walk along a comparatively gentle slope, but it becomes a real mountain trail after passing the sixth station. Because there are many huts along the trail, you can often buy a bottled drink, have a meal, and rest. You also need not worry because there are many restrooms. If you are injured or become sick, there are first-aid stations at the seventh and eighth stations. You will never get lost because there are many other climbers, but you can't avoid congestion either. Because many climbers queue up before dawn to view the sunrise from the summit, you need to make a plan allowing enough time. You can admire the sunrise even along the way. Therefore, one choice to avoid congestion would be to delay the time compared to other climbers and enjoy a leisurely climb.

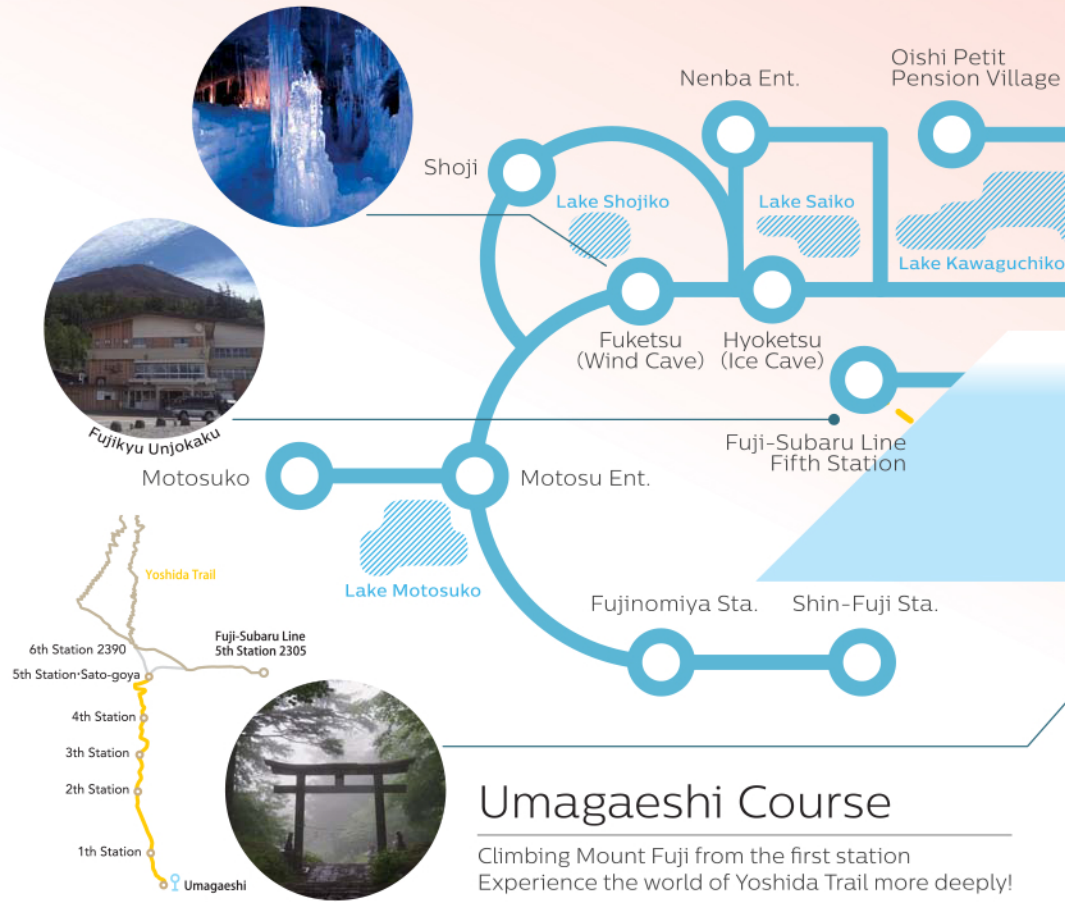

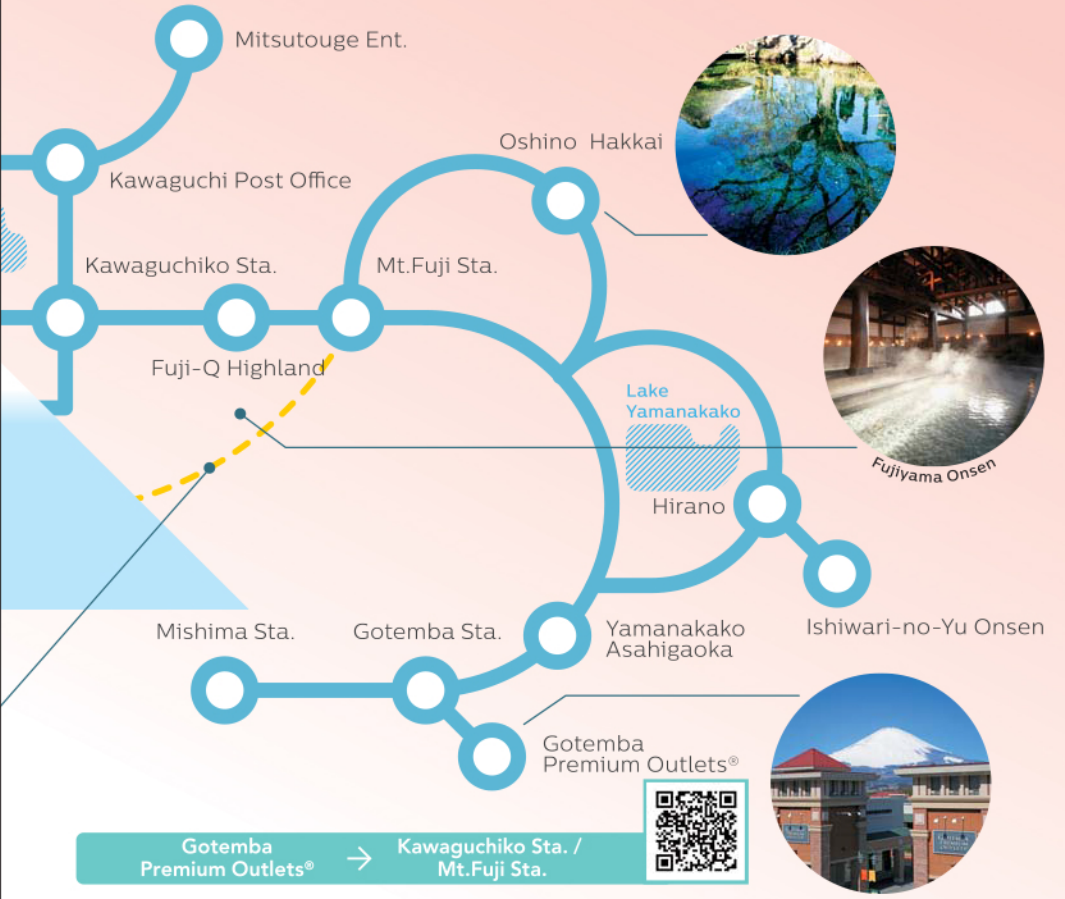

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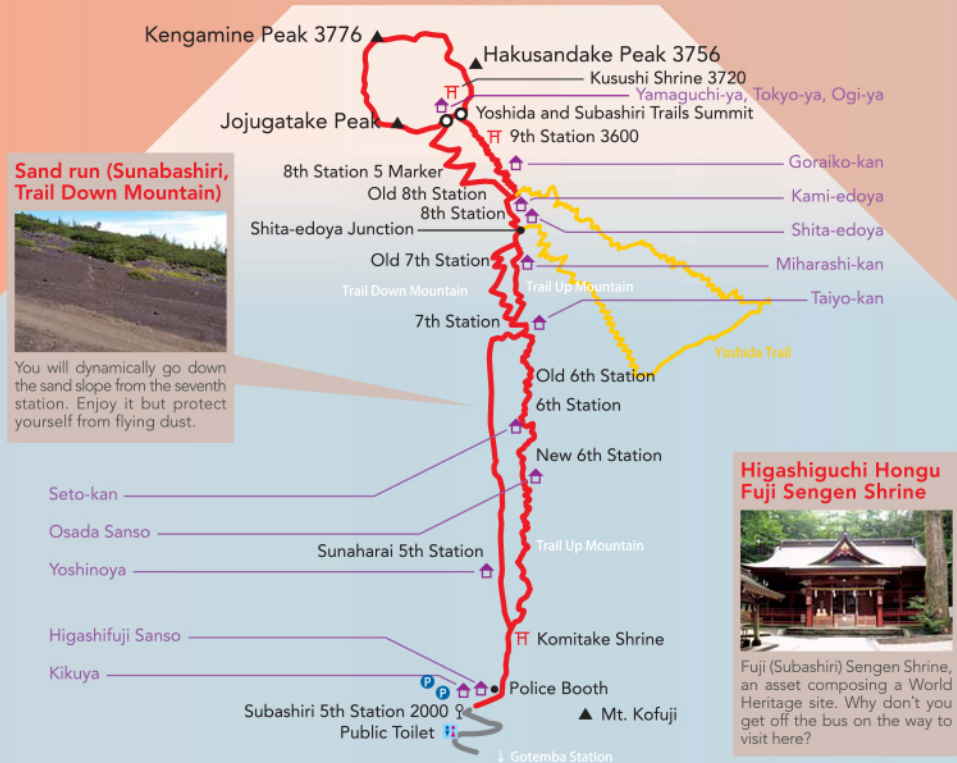
Subashiri Trail

Subashiri Fifth Station (2000 m) ▶▶▶ Kusushi Shrine (3720 m)

The course allows you to enjoy greenery and alpine plants of the forest.
For descending, you dynamically go down the "sand run."

Standard time required
Up: 6.5 hours, Down: 3 hours

You will dynamically go down the sand slope from the seventh station. Enjoy it but protect yourself from flying dust.

Higashiguchi Hongu Fuji Sengen Shrine

Fuji (Subashiri) Sengen Shrine, an asset composing a World Heritage site. Why don't you get off the bus on the way to visit here?

The Subashiri Trail is popular for the sand run, where you dynamically go down a steep slope. You approach the trail from the east side of Mount Fuji. As the altitude of the fifth station is lower than that of the Yoshida Trail by approximately 300 m, you naturally need to take longer. Also, as there are fewer huts and you can enjoy climbing in a comparatively quiet atmosphere, the trail is popular for those who have experience climbing and for repeat climbers. Walking in the forest continuing from the entrance, alpine flowers blooming at your feet will please the eyes. The trail is very rich in nature up to around the altitude of 2,700 m. You can't rest as often as on the Yoshida Trail because there are fewer huts, so it's better to prepare drinking water and portable foods in advance.

This trail meets the Yoshida Trail at the old eighth station, after which you take the same route as the Yoshida Trail climbers up to the summit. For descending, take the same route as the Yoshida Trail until the eighth station, but use a separate trail from the Shita-edoya hut. From the seventh station, enjoy the dynamic sand run where you go straight down the sand slope. We recommend preparing a mask and sunglasses to avoid the clouds of dust.

Gotemba Trail

Gotemba New Fifth Station (1440 m) ▶▶▶ Sengen-taisha Okumiya Shrine (3715 m)

With the longest distance and greatest difference in elevation, this trail is liked by repeat climbers and experienced climbers. Go down the great sand run when descending.

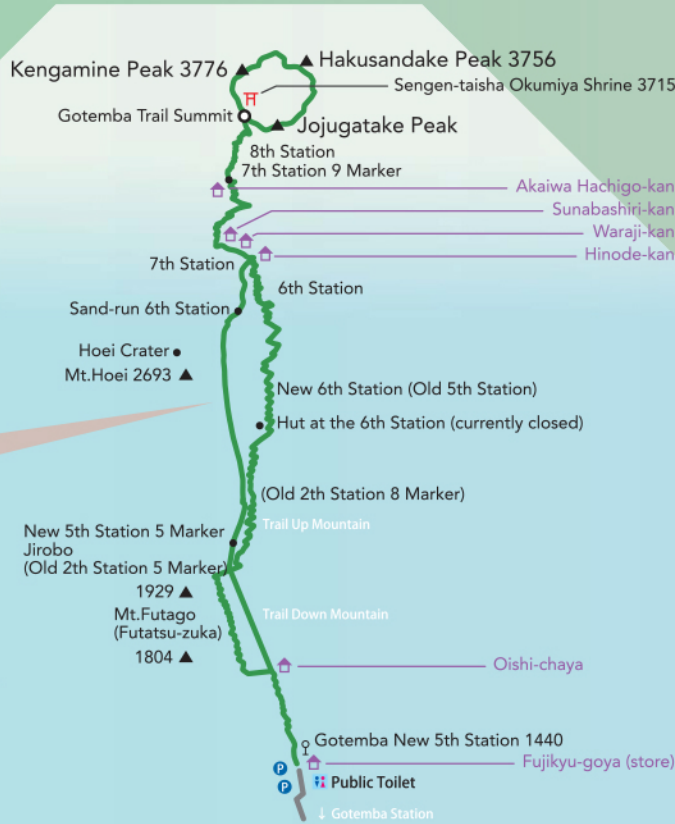

Great sand run (Osunabashiri, Trail Down Mountain)



The area from the sixth station of the descending trail to Jirobo is covered with thick volcanic ash and referred to as Osunabashiri (great sand run). Every time you step forward, your feet sink to the ankle and you can descend very fast. You can also enjoy the scenery looking down the Hakone Mountain Range and Suruga Bay.



The Gotemba Trail is the physically hardest route among the four trails. As it starts from the elevation of 1,440 m, it naturally offers a longer distance and greater difference of elevation than the other routes. The difference in elevation up to the summit is as great as 2,336 m, which is quite considerable even in terms of general mountain climbing. The trail, therefore, should be tried by those who have experience climbing or repeat climbers. People make an overnight plan.

After you depart from the Gotemba new fifth station, you'll soon come to a sandy path. After passing the Oishi-chaya hut, there are no other huts at all until the seventh station. Don't forget to carry drinking water and portable foods. The sandy path continues for what may seem forever until the seventh station. On sunny days, you need to climb under a hot sun. It is important to keep your own rhythm without straining yourself. There are three huts on the seventh station, but no more above it. Don't forget to make a reservation for accommodations. For descending, the great sand run starts from the seventh station. You can enjoy running straight down the slope covered with thick volcanic ash while watching the scenery. As on the Subashiri Trail, don't forget to take measures against the clouds of dust.

The elevation of its fifth station is the highest, and the climbing distance is the shortest among the four trails. The goal is the closest to Kengamine Peak.



Prince Route

The course from the sixth station of the Fujinomiya Trail to Mount Hoei and then to the Gotemba Trail is generally called the Prince Route. The course became popular when the Crown Prince of Japan climbed Mount Fuji for the first time in 2008.

The Fujinomiya Trail is on the southern face of Mount Fuji with a shorter walking distance and a smaller difference in elevation. Although it's short, the trail is also steep. It's the most popular next to the Yoshida Trail because of the short distance. What is different from the other trails, however, is that it doesn't have a descending-only trail; therefore, you need to walk on the same path when both climbing up and down. The trail not only is popular and has many climbers, but also could be highly congested at peak times. Although the time normally required is short, you need to make a plan with enough time taking congestion into consideration.

The elevation of the fifth station is 2,390 m. Instead of starting to climb right away, take time to acclimate yourself to the elevation to prevent altitude illness. First, you walk along a black sand and gravel path, and then a rocky trail after the seventh station. There also is the Mt. Fuji Health Center at the eighth station. After this, the slope becomes steeper, so you need to walk carefully. One of the reasons that the Fujinomiya Trail is popular is that its summit is the closest to Kengamine Peak, which is the highest point of Mount Fuji. On the summit, there are Sengen-taisha Okumiya Shrine and a seasonally open post office as well.
